The Scott C. Lippiatt family

Scott joined the Mississippi Army National Guard in September of 1985. He became a military policeman for three years and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in 1988. Scott was mobilized for Desert Storm in 91. He was sent to Fort Lewis, WA to backfill the MP's in the Desert. In 1996, Scott commanded the 114th MP Company in Clinton, MS and mobilized his company for Hurricane George. Scott was deployed in 2004 in Baghdad to secure Saddam Hussein and his government leaders at Camp



Cropper. His unit was moved to Fallujah with 18 hours notice, to support the 1st Marine Division during the April uprising. His unit then was assigned to the Green Zone along with the Navy Seals to secure the five interim government officials providing security to their residences and escort security. His unit also reopened and secured the American Embassy and UN Compound in Baghdad. Scott was moved up to the Battalion S3/Operations Officer during that timeframe. Scott mobilized again for Hurricane Katrina and ensured that over 800 military policeman from all of the country completed their mission. Scott was deployed again in 2009 to Afghanistan where he served as an Engineer Brigade Personnel Officer and was moved to FOB Sharana to provide overall security for the 5000 person base. He is currently deployed to Afghanistan with the Engineers providing deconstruction operations. Scott is due to return home before the 4th of July. Scott has received two Bronze Stars and 2 Meritorious Service medals for those aforementioned assignments.

Scott is married to Jennifer and has two children Patrick and Sarah. He would like to thank the great neighbors that helped Jennifer this past year.

3rd Annual Independence Day Celebration June 28 at The Rez

An orchestrated, dueling fireworks show from each side of the lake will highlight Barnett Reservoir's 3rd annual Independence Day Celebration, which will be held June 28 at both Lakeshore and Old Trace Parks.

Hosted by the Barnett Reservoir Foundation and the Pearl River Valley Water Supply District in partnership with the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality and many local businesses, the event will feature activities for all ages beginning at 4 p.m. Parks will open at 3 p.m. for walk-in patrons and the activities begin at 4 p.m. Admission is free.



Both parks will include live music — headlined by The Chill at

Old Trace Park and Chris Gill and the Sole Shakers at Lakeshore, kid zones, military displays, food and beverage vendors and great views of the Lighted Boat Parade and the fireworks show.

At Old Trace Park, DEQ's annual WaterFest will be featured from 4-7 p.m., with both fun and educational opportunities for youngsters.

Lakeshore Park will feature a Classic Car Cruise-In and a first-ever Cardboard Boat Race, which is being sponsored by the Reservoir YMCA. The Cardboard Boat Race will be held in the shallow cove between Lakeshore Park and Timberlake Campground, and will begin at 5 p.m.

Around sunset (about 8:20 p.m.), the Lighted Boat Parade will leave MainHarbor and cruise up the Madison County shore past Old Trace Park and the judging station at the Jackson Yacht Club before turning east across The Rez to pass by Lakeshore Park. Adjutant General Augustus Collins serves as the Parade Grand Marshall and will lead the parade on the houseboat, Friendship, with his special guests from the Brain Injury Association of MS and Wounded Warriors.

Music and other events at both parks will wrap up around 9:15 and the attention will focus on the water for the unique fireworks show. The countdown to the dueling fireworks will begin at 9:30 p.m. on a simulcast via MISS103 FM.

For early risers and runners, the Brain Injury Association of MS will host a 5K run at 8:00 a.m., registration at 7:30 a.m., at Old Trace Park.
